## <u>SCL Health | St. Mary's and Memorial Regional Health</u> <u>collaborate to form new health care model</u>

**Grand Junction, CO** - Memorial Regional Health (MRH) and SCL Health|St. Mary's announced today the two healthcare organizations have solidified a decades-long working relationship through a new Care Affiliate agreement. The agreement is a creative model that allows Memorial Regional Health to access the services and benefits of a larger health system, while continuing to remain independent.

"Medical teams from St. Mary's Medical Center and Memorial Regional Health have been coordinating care since there was a road between us. Our long-standing partnership is the foundation for this new Care Affiliation agreement," says Brian Davidson, MD, president of St. Mary's Medical Center.

Members from both organizations will form a new steering committee to determine the specific areas of focus. By working collaboratively, Memorial Regional Health and SCL Health | St. Mary's can help ensure that local care and local governance can be protected, while the access and quality of care can be advanced.

"Rural medical facilities are under great pressure to maintain local patient services and independent operations, in an environment of limited resources," says Andrew Daniels, CEO of Memorial Regional Health. "I reached out to St. Mary's to discuss an agreement to support those goals. This collaboration will improve care as our new steering committee works together. Our objective is to keep our patients as close to home as possible, and access the larger system services that St. Mary's can bring to the table. It's a great way for both organizations to work together on behalf of the patients." Daniels concluded.

Outreach clinics for neurology, neurosurgery, and medical oncology at MRH will continue as the steering committee considers additional areas of focus. Expanded clinical and telehealth services will be discussed. A path toward SCL Connect's version of the Epic electronic medical records (EMR) system is another promising component. Patients on the Epic system gain centrally located medical records accessible to caregivers across the nation. Epic is the one of the largest EMR systems in the United States. Access to medical records can be especially important in a medical emergency.

"Our partnership with SCL Health has been invaluable toward advancing our care coordination efforts. At the end of the day, this agreement can support better outcomes through better care coordination. That's what really matters," says Daniels.
