



## Moab Regional Hospital Aces Medicare Inspection

Recent Inspection Results in 100% Compliance

MOAB, UT July 30, 2018 – Moab Regional Hospital was recently surveyed by the Utah Department of Health on behalf of the Centers for Medicaid and Medicare Services. The inspection resulted in zero deficiencies.

The Center performs routine unannounced surveys of all hospitals. The survey, performed every 3 years, is to ensure compliance with Medicare and Medicaid regulations. Surveyors interview staff, observe care and procedures, check records on care, confidentiality, cleanliness, patient rights and quality of service. Moab Regional Hospital's inspection last week reflected a 100% passing score. A hospital receiving zero deficiencies is relatively rare. It shows that all services provided meet or exceed all state and federal standards.

"When everyone is moving toward the common goal of the hospital's mission...*our dedicated team puts the patient first...*, it yields this kind of survey outcome. I am so incredibly proud of our team of providers, patient care staff and support staff, who collaborate on a daily basis to do what is best for the patient" said Vicki Gigliotti, Chief Clinical Officer at Moab Regional Hospital.
